Registration

You must be at least 16 years of age and a Clay or Platte County resident to participate. Preregistration is required.

Walk-in registrations will not be accepted. All student paperwork must be completed before student will be allowed to attend classes. Sign up immediately upon receiving your brochure; first come, first served. **Classes fill up quickly.**

Please Read Carefully!

You MUST arrive to class ON TIME. Students arriving 10 minutes after the start of class must wait in the hallway until their next class to avoid disturbing other students, as well as teachers. Please take a look at your calendar, as we expect each student to attend 5 out of 6 class days. Please return all registration forms to **ACED**, 215 W. Pershing Rd, 5th floor, Kansas City, MO 64108. Minimum enrollment is required to offer a class. You may enroll online and send your check or money order by mail as soon as you register. **Please do not send cash.** Mail to the address on the registration card. You may bring check or money order on the first day of class. **Do not bring cash payments to campus.**

Refund Policy

If you withdraw from classes one week before classes begin, credit will be given for the next semester. To withdraw from a class, please call **ACED** at 816-235-1754. No cash refunds are possible.

Certificate of Completion

A certificate of completion will be given to students who complete 5 of the 6 Saturdays. Special recognition will be given for perfect attendance.

Attendance

It is your responsibility to come to class and be on time. If you arrive more than 10 minutes after the start of class, you will be seated in the hallway, and will not be admitted to class. Staff or parents must stay until the beginning of the next hour.


